Applicant NAME OF INTENDED PAROLED-IN, and her son, XXX, are currently in hiding and are seeking relief through humanitarian parole in order to escape the death threats and attacks they are facing in Afghanistan.

This life-threatening situation started back from March 3, 2012, after INTENDED PAROLED-IN's or the family member working for the U.S. Government was unfairly terminated her job with the U.S. Navy as an interpreter, or was falsely accused of traitor after seeing speaking with U.S Uniformed personnel... etc . Write all the details regarding your client's case.

As you may know, Afghanistan, being such an unstable country, has many difficulties controlling the Taliban and its own government officials, or ... use your client's case and country conditions from the Department of States regarding Human Rights in Afghanistan for the current year of filing the parole request, and any news articles portraying cases similar to that of your client. Enclosed with this letter, please find Form I-131, Request for Advance Parole Document, Form I-134, Affidavit of Support and supporting documents. See also a copy of threat signed by INTENDED PAROLED-IN.

It should be no argument that INTENDED PAROLED-IN, and her son, are in great danger as they continue to reside in such an unstable environment that exhibits such violence. As she is the first to be released on bail in Afghanistan for this matter, she may be one of the first to be able to survive, however if she continues to reside in Afghanistan, or any Muslim-majority country, for that matter, the likeliness of her survival is at minimum. It is to this, that humanitarian relief is requested.

INTENDED PAROLED-IN has tried obtaining SIV, or non-immigrant visa, or has registered with the UNHR office in Kabul, etc to no avail. See attached copies of applications or denials.
